Our course in China will be co-sponsored by The American Academy of Minimally Invasive Spinal Medicine and Surgery and the American College of Physicians & Surgeons. The Course Chairman is Dr. John C. Chiu and the Course Director is Dr. Merrill W. Reuter. Being a native of China, Dr. Chiu is fluent in the Chinese language and speaks 5 dialects. By joining forces we believe we can offer a top-notch MISS course for spine related physicians and surgeons combined with exotic travel and the unique opportunity to witness how



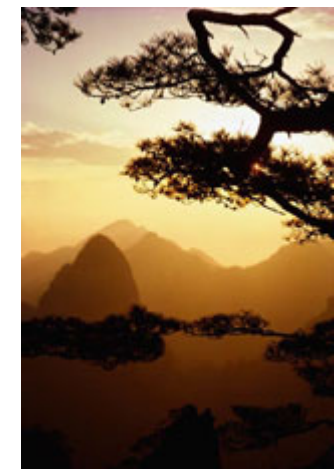
spinal medicine and surgery is performed in China. The AAMISMS/MISU China 2007 course will begin with live surgery, didactic sessions and workshops at Dr. John Chiu's surgery center near Los Angeles. In China we will visit medical centers as well as have symposia and didactic sessions. The trip will also include touring activities like Chinese acrobats, visiting the Great Wall and city tours of Shanghai and Beijing.



All course participants are encouraged to make this a family trip. There will be plenty of time set aside for tours while in China so spouses and children will not feel left out. We have structured the scientific part of the trip so that it will have minimal impact on family members.

The course will consist of live surgery, didactic sessions, hands-on workshops, multi-disciplinary symposium and course syllabus. All attendees of the courses will gain sufficient exposure to the state of the art procedures in total spine care which will improve the opportunities for their patients.

This course is open to all physicians and surgeons who practice spine-related medicine such as orthopaedic surgeons, neurosurgeons, neurologists, physiatrists and pain management/anesthesiologists. Fellows, Residents and Allied Health Professionals are also encouraged to attend.

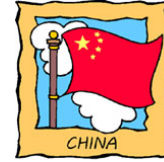

If you plan to travel to China from outside of the United States (LAX airport) you will need to make your own flight arrangements. You can still be part of the group in China. If you plan to make any detour trips in China or nearby countries before or after the course, please consult with our travel agent. Additional fees will apply to make any detours based on flight and tour prices.

The group deadline is January 20, 2007. Full payment and the list of person(s) traveling in your party must be made by then. After January 20, 2007 the group rate will no longer apply with space subject to availability for flights and hotels. Please check availability with our travel agent before registering for the course.

The AAMISMS/MISU China 2007 course will begin at the California Center for Minimally Invasive Spine Surgery: California Spine Institute Medical Center, in Newbury Park, California – www.spinecenter.com. Dr. John C. Chiu is the Medical Director of this state of the art facility. The center is located in Thousand Oaks approximately 45 miles northwest of LAX airport in Los Angeles. The day will begin with live endoscopic spine surgery, followed by lectures and hands on workshop. Travel to China

Day 2: Saturday - March 31

The travel arrangements and all tours while in China are being arranged by CITUS USA – www.citsusa.com - of Pasadena, California. CITS USA is the only North American arm of the largest and most prestigious tour operator in China - China International Travel Service - and specializes in travel to, and in China. Once you have made your course registration, you will need to contact Frank Li at CITS USA to book your trip to China. They can handle all of the necessary Visas for you. China is situated in east Asia and is the third largest country in area in the world but holds the world's largest population - over one billion people or about 20 per cent of the world's population. As one of the oldest countries, it has a rich history spanning thousands of years. Most of the citizens live in the eastern part of the country where the large cities are and the farming is sustainable. Agriculture is the primary economic force and over half of all workers are farmers. The Communist Party took over the government in 1949 and remains in control today. In recent years the government has loosened control of the economy and allowed more free enterprise. China is now a global economic force where many citizens have improved their impoverished lives but many still live a simple agrarian life.

Shanghai

Day 3: Sunday - April 1
Includes Lunch and Dinner

The first stop in China will be Beijing where we will transfer to a flight to Shanghai for four nights. We will be staying at the Jin Jiang Hotel, pictured to the right. The hotel was opened in 1929 and has had many dignitaries stay there, including President Richard Nixon in 1972. Shanghai is the largest industrial city in China, with a population of 18.7 million which includes a floating population of 2 million. It is situated on the estuary of the Yangtze River and is one of China's most important seaports. Shanghai is known as the "Oriental Paris" with its abundant shopping on such famous streets as Nanjing Road. Shanghai has a subtropical maritime monsoon climate. The best times to visit are the spring and fall. After a rest in the hotel, we will step out for an orientation tour of Shanghai, followed by dinner and a sensational viewing of the Shanghai Acrobat Show. Chinese acrobatics are one of the world's oldest forms of entertainment, a delightful artistic form that all people of all ages can enjoy.

Day 4: Monday - April 2
Includes Breakfast and Dinner



The course participants will meet in the morning to visit local hospitals and health institutes. In the afternoon we will tour YuYuan Gardens, a classical Chinese garden featuring many pavilions and ponds. Take a short ride on the High Speed train in Shanghai (Maglev Train) to experience this first ever high-speed train in China. In the evening there will be a Welcome Reception Dinner in Beckingham Hall at Jin Jiang Hotel.

Day 5: Tuesday - April 3

Includes Breakfast, Lunch and Dinner

In the morning there will be a lumbar educational session for the course participants in the conference hall at the hotel. In the afternoon we sponsor a trip to the Bund, another famous street and waterfront in China, where major firms of the far east were headquartered. A two hour cruise on the Huangpu River will be followed by a tour of the Pudong new Development Zone and the Shanghai TV Tower - also called the Oriental Pearl. This magnificent tower is 1,536 feet high - the world's third tallest TV and radio tower. In the evening there will be a Reception Dinner at a local restaurant.

Day 6: Wednesday - April 4

Includes Breakfast, Lunch and Dinner

This will be our final day in Shanghai. A cervical educational session for course participants will be held in the morning in the conference hall at the hotel. Following the scientific session, we visit the Shanghai Museum which has an impressive collection of Chinese art, coins, furniture and other cultural relics from various nationalities over thousands of years. We will also visit the Shanghai Music Hall, which was raised and moved to a nearby location in 2003, as well as the French Concession area. A special Chinese Dinner in the evening will complete our four day/night visit to Shanghai.

Beijing

Day 7: Thursday - April 5

Includes Breakfast and Dinner

We will depart for a two hour flight to Beijing in the morning. The weather in Beijing in early April will probably be cooler than Shanghai so bring appropriate attire for cool evenings. After settling in at the International Hotel Beijing, pictured to the right, we will tour Tiananmen Square and the Forbidden City. Tiananmen Square is the large plaza near the center of Beijing. It is the largest open space in an urban location in the world. In 1989 it was the sight of protests which were ended in violence by the government.



The Forbidden City, also called the Forbidden Palace, is located in the exact center of the ancient city of Beijing. It was the imperial palace during the mid-Ming and Qing dynasties. In 1987 it was declared by the World Heritage Site as the "Imperial Palace of the Ming and Qing Dynasties." It has 800 buildings and over 8,000 rooms and UNESCO lists it as the largest collection of preserved ancient wooden structures in the world. The grounds are directly north of Tiananmen Square and are accessed through the Tiananmen Gate. The area surrounding it is called Imperial City. The evening will begin with a Northern style Chinese Dinner followed by the Peking Opera Show at the famous Lao She Tea House. The establishment is named after Lao She, a famous pre-revolutionary writer who penned the play "Tea House." Peking Opera is a 200 year old Chinese art, beloved by many locals.

Beijing

Day 8: Friday - April 6

Includes Breakfast, Lunch and Dinner



We leave early in the morning for a full day tour to the Great Wall (at Badaling section) and Ming Tombs, with the Spirit Way. The Badaling section of the wall is northwest of Beijing in Yanqing County. The function of this section of the Great Wall was to protect Juyongguan Pass in the Jundu Mountains. This section was the earliest to be opened to tourists and since then 130 million visitors from China and abroad. The Badaling section of the Great Wall was made using huge bar stones. The inside of the walls are comprised of mud and stone block. The top floor was made smooth by using square bricks. Fire signal platforms were used in ancient times to send warning signals of encroaching enemies, using the number of fires to signify how many men were approaching. Back in Beijing for the

evening, we will enjoy a magnificent Farewell Dinner at the famous Peking Duck Restaurant. This 5th generation owned restaurant has been serving it's famous fare since 1852.

Day 9: Saturday - April 7

Includes Breakfast, Lunch and Dinner

In the morning we will have a multi-disciplinary symposium for course participants, followed by a tour of a Chinese medicine hospital. Next we will tour the Summer Palace and Temple of Heaven. In 1998 UNESCO listed the Summer Palace as a World Heritage Site. This archetypal Chinese garden is considered one of the most classical gardens in the world. It was constructed during the Jin Dynasty (1115-1234). It went on to provide royal families with a splendid garden for rest and entertainment. The Temple of Heaven is larger than the Forbidden City but smaller than the Summer Palace. Constructed in 1420 during the Ming Dynasty, it was created to offer sacrifices to Heaven. After our final touring, we will head to the airport for our 8:00 PM flight back to LAX. We will arrive in Los Angeles at 5:00 PM local time the same day, April 7, 2007.
